MATHCOUNTS VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!!

The South Piedmont Chapter-PENC MATHCOUNTS Competition will be held Tuesday, February 19, 2008 at the UNC-Charlotte Cone Center.

The South Piedmont Chapter-PENC MATHCOUNTS Competition will be held Tuesday, February 19, 2008 at the UNC-Charlotte Cone Center. We are in need of volunteers to assist us in the following areas:

- o Proctors (Need 6-7) Distribute tests, pencils, scratch paper, etc.; read testing instructions; monitor the students during the testing to be sure no one is talking or revealing answers; collecting the tests and taking them to the scoring room; etc.
- o Scoring (Need 20+) Grade each round (3 rounds total), tabulate results, and provide results to the individual running the scoring program.
- o Registration (Need 4) Make sure each school participating signs in and updates any changes to their rosters prior to the competition, gets the updated registration list to the scoring room to revise the scoring program as needed, and handout tee-shirts to each student participating. o Countdown Round - (Need 3) Reading the questions to the students for each

round, judges to determine if the answers are correct (all judges will have an answer sheet.

- o Refreshments (Need 2) Oversee to break area to ensure students don't take too much and prevent others from getting any refreshments.
- o Clean-up (Need all who can help) Helping clean the rooms following testing, refreshment breaks, grading, etc.

None of these jobs is very difficult. Anyone grading or judging will be given answer sheets. The proctors basically monitor the testing room just like someone does during the SAT's or any other timed test. The instructions are straight forward, and we will provide stop watches, scratch paper, and pencils.

We will start registering schools at 1:00 PM Tuesday, February 19th.

All volunteers (except graders) will need to report to UNCC's Cone Center by 12:00 PM Tuesday the 19th to get

their assignments and start preparing their specific areas. Those scoring/ grading the tests will need to report by 1:30 PM to get to their assigned room and get the scoring information needed prior to the start of the testing. They are dismissed after all tests are graded and scores are entered into the scoring system. The competition begins at 2:00 PM with 3 rounds of tests plus the final Countdown Round. We anticipate completing everything by 7 PM+/-.

National Engineers Week Foundation


